
thousands of lives. It is an absolute asset to emergency preparedness, and peace of mind, for every household and community across the nation.




A Message From The Town Nurse:

HOW TO REMOVE A TICK:

- ☐ Wash hands.
- ☐ Using clean tweezers, grasp the tick mouthparts as close to the skin as possible. (Do not grasp, squeeze or twist the body of the tick as this may spread infected body fluids. Do not burn or use ANY substance on the tick.)
- ☐ Pull tick straight out.
- ☐ Use antiseptic on skin.
- \square Wash hands thoroughly.



The SHINE Program provides FREE, unbiased, health insurance counseling to all Mass residents with Medicare, their caregivers, and those approaching Medicare eligibility.

MEDICARE WILL BE ISSUING NEW MEDICARE CARDS

Between April of 2018 and April of 2019, Medicare will be removing Social Security numbers from Medicare cards and mailing each person a new card. *PLEASE beware of anyone who contacts you about your new Medicare*

card. Medicare will <u>not</u> ask you for personal or private information to get your new Medicare number and card. s

HOME MODIFICATION LOAN PROGRAM

If you or a household member is disabled or an elder, the Home Modification Loan Program can provide a loan so you can make needed adaptations or modifications to your home. Modifications can help you remain in your home and live more independently. This state funded loan program can help you live independently at home by providing 0% and 3% interest loans. This is a great way to have ramps, stair lift and kitchen and bath adaptations done.

SENIOR CITIZEN PROPERTY TAX WORK-OFF PROGRAM

This program allows Ashby homeowners, age 65+ to reduce property taxes by up to \$600 per year by working for the Town of Ashby.

- Applicant must meet eligibility requirements, must have appropriate skills and physical ability for position, and the Applicant and Department Head must both agree the job is an appropriate match;
- Job Opportunities are based on individual department needs;


